ARTICLE 1
Authorize Board of Selectmen to Acquire, Obtain, Abandon or Relocate Easements
(Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen, during Fiscal Year 2017, to acquire on behalf of the Town any and all easements for any of the following purposes: roads, sidewalks, vehicular and/or pedestrian access or passage, drainage and utilities, provided however that such authorization pertains only to easements acquired at no cost to the Town; and, further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen during Fiscal Year 2017 to abandon or relocate easements acquired for any of the foregoing purposes; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 2
Committee Article
(Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to receive the reports of town officers, boards, and committees; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 3
Structured Tax Agreement
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 59, Section 38H of the Massachusetts General Laws, or other applicable law, will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into an agreement with Highland Street Natick Solar LLC or its affiliate or assignee for payment in lieu of real and personal property taxes with respect to solar photovoltaic electric-generating facilities on land owned by the Walnut Hill Prep School at 12 Highland Street, Natick MA (Town of Natick Assessors' Map 36, Lot 236A) and, further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen, the Town Administrator, and the Board of Selectmen's designee(s) to take any action necessary to accomplish the purposes of this article; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 4
Elected Officials Salary
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to fix the salary and compensation of all elected officers of the Town of Natick for Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017) as provided by Section 108 of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, as amended; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 5
Personnel Board Classification and Pay Plan
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town, pursuant to the authority contained in Section 108A of Chapter 41 of the General Laws, will vote to amend the by-laws by adding to Article 24, Section 3, a new paragraph deleting certain position titles, adding new position titles and effecting changes in the salary ranges as presently established; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 6
Collective Bargaining
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or otherwise provide, the funds necessary to implement the Terms of Agreements reached between the Town and the following collective bargaining units:

- a) Public Employees Local Union 1116 of the Laborers International Union of North America – Clerical Unit
- b) Public Employees Local Union 1116 of the Laborers International Union of North America – Public Works Laborers Unit

Or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 7
Fiscal 2016 Omnibus Budget Article
(Town Administrator)

To determine what sum or sums of money the Town will appropriate and raise, or transfer from available funds, for the operation of the government of the Town of Natick, including debt and interest, during Fiscal Year 2016 (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016) and to provide for a reserve fund for Fiscal Year 2016, and to see what budgets for Fiscal 2016 will be reduced to offset said additional appropriations; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 8
Fiscal 2017 Omnibus Budget Article
(Town Administrator)

To determine what sum of money the Town will appropriate and raise, or transfer from available funds, for the operation of the government of the Town of Natick, including debt and interest during Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017), and to provide for a reserve fund for Fiscal Year 2017; or to otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 9
Morse Institute Library Fiscal 2017 Budget
(Town Administrator)

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or otherwise provide, for the maintenance and operation of the Morse Institute Library, for Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017); or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 10
Bacon Free Library Fiscal 2016 Budget
(Town Administrator)

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or transfer from available funds for the maintenance and operation of the Bacon Free Library for Fiscal Year 2016 (July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016); or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 11
Bacon Free Library Fiscal 2017 Budget
(Town Administrator)

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or otherwise provide, for the maintenance and operation of the Bacon Free Library, for Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017); or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 12
School Bus Transportation Subsidy
(Superintendent of Schools)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, or transfer from available funds, a sum of money for the purpose of operation and administration of the school bus transportation system, and to reduce or offset fees charged for students who elect to use the school bus transportation system for transportation to and from school, for Fiscal Year 2017 (July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017); or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 13
Re-Authorization of Revolving Funds
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the use of revolving funds previously established pursuant to votes of Town Meeting; to determine: 1) the programs and purposes for which each such revolving fund may be expended; 2) the departmental receipts which shall be credited to each such revolving fund; 3) the board, department or officer authorized to expend money from each such revolving fund; and 4) a limit on the total amount which may be expended from each such revolving fund in the fiscal year which begins on July 1, 2016; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 14
Capital Equipment
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, borrow or otherwise provide, a sum of money as may be required for capital equipment for the various departments of the Town of Natick; to determine whether this appropriation shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 15
Capital Improvement
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, borrow or otherwise provide, a sum of money to implement a Capital Improvement Program, to protect the physical infrastructure of the Town of Natick; to determine whether this appropriation shall be raised by borrowing or otherwise; or to otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 16
Stabilization Fund
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from available funds for the purpose of supplementing the stabilization fund established under Article 22 of the warrant for Annual Town Meeting of 1961, as authorized by Chapter 40, Section 5B of the General Laws, as amended; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 17
Operational/Rainy Day Stabilization Fund
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from available funds for the purpose of supplementing the Operational Stabilization Fund established by vote of the 2011 Spring Annual Town Meeting under Article 4, as authorized by Chapter 40, Section 5B of the General Laws, as amended; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 18
Capital Stabilization Fund
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from available funds for the purpose of supplementing the Capital Stabilization Fund established under Article 2 of the warrant for Fall Annual Town Meeting of 2010, as authorized by Chapter 40, Section 5B of the General Laws, as amended; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 19
Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) Fund
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from available funds for the purpose of funding the Other Post-Employment Benefits Liability Trust Fund authorized by vote of the 2011 Fall Annual Town Meeting under Article 8 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 32B, Section 20 of the General Laws, as amended; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 20
Rescind Authorized, Unissued Debt
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to rescind the authorization for unissued debt that has been determined is no longer needed for the completion of various projects; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 21
Increase Personal Property Exemptions
(Board of Assessors)

To see if the Town will vote to increase the Personal Exemption Amounts by 50% under the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Acts of 1986 as amended by Chapter 126 of the Acts of 1988 which provides for "Optional Additional Property Tax Exemptions" allowing an annually determined, uniform increase in the amount of exemption in General Laws, Chapter 59 Section 5 Clauses 17D, 22, 22A, 22B, 22C, 22E, 37A, and 41C (elderly person, disabled veteran, or blind person); or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 22
Unpaid Bills
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, or otherwise provide such sums of money as may be required for the payment of unpaid bills of previous years, incurred by the departments, boards and officers of the Town of Natick; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 23
Conservation Fund Study Committee Report
(Conservation Fund Study Committee)

To see what action the Town will take to hear and/or accept the report of the Conservation Fund Study Committee or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 24
Rescinding Previous Appropriations
(Conservation Fund Study Committee)

To see what actions the Town will take to rescind the appropriation under Article 19 of Fall 2014 Town Meeting or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 25
Change To A Definition in the Zoning Bylaw
(Conservation Fund Study Committee)

To see what actions the Town will take to amend or change the definition of "Open Space Public Benefit Amenity" in the Town of Natick Zoning ByLaw or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 26
Home Rule Petition: Simplified Street Acceptance Process
(Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to petition the General Court to enact legislation in substantially the following form, provided that the General Court may reasonably vary the form and substance of the requested legislation within the scope of the general public objectives of the petition.

“AN ACT relative to the procedure for municipal acceptance of subdivision roads in the town of Natick.

*Be it enacted in the Senate and house of Representatives in General Court assembled,
and by the authority of the same as follows:*

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding chapters 79 and 82 of the General Laws or any other general or special law to the contrary, the town of Natick may employ the procedure hereinafter set out for municipal acceptance of roads constructed within a subdivision in accordance with a definitive subdivision plan that has been approved pursuant to the subdivision control law, as defined in section 81K of chapter 41 of the General Laws.

The board of selectmen of the town of Natick shall hold a public hearing, after first giving (i) written notice by first-class mail, postage prepaid, to the owner of record of each property abutting the road or roads, as appears from the records of the town of Natick assessors, and (ii) notice by publication in a newspaper of local circulation at least 7 days prior to the hearing. The records of the town of Natick assessors shall be conclusive for purposes of this act. The sole purpose of the public hearing shall be to determine whether it is in the public interest to accept the road or roads as a public way. If said board of selectmen determines, after the public hearing, that it is in the public interest to accept the road or roads, they shall so vote, by a majority vote, and place an article on the warrant for the next annual or special town meeting for acceptance of the road or roads.

Upon a two-thirds vote of town meeting to accept the road or roads, said board of selectmen shall prepare for recording at the Middlesex county registry of deeds an order of acceptance setting forth the vote of the town meeting. The order of acceptance shall contain a description of or reference to a plan showing the boundaries and measurements of the road or roads, which may be an existing approved and recorded definitive subdivision plan. The order of acceptance shall be recorded within thirty (30) days following the town meeting vote and, upon recordation, shall operate to vest ownership of a permanent roadway easement in the road or roads for all purposes for which public ways are commonly used in the town of Natick, together with ownership of all utility, drainage, access and other easements shown on the plan and specifically identified in the order of acceptance, as well as all pipes, structures and other improvements located therein, in the town of Natick with no additional notice or other action required. No owner or interest holder of land abutting a road so accepted or subject to an easement shown on said plan shall have any claim for compensation against the town of Natick on account of said acceptance.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.”

ARTICLE 27

Acquisition of the CSX Saxonville Branch (Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire by gift, purchase, or otherwise, for general municipal purposes, including without limitation recreational and transportation purposes, land known as the Saxonville Branch line and adjoining parcels, owned now or formerly by CSX Transportation, Inc., and shown on Natick Assessors Map 41, Lot RR1; Map 17, Lots 13, 14, 18 and 19; Map 26, Lot 40A; Map 35, Lot 296; and Map 43, Lots 413A and 413B; which land shall be used for the proposed Cochituate Rail Trail, a plan for which is on file with the office of the Natick Community and Economic Development Department, and for which construction has been approved for federal and state funding, and further, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, borrow or otherwise provide for the purposes of this article; and, further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen and other applicable boards, commissions, and personnel to apply for and receive grants or gifts for the purposes of this article, and to take all action necessary or appropriate to accomplish the purposes of this article; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 28

Acquisition of the So-Called Wonderbread Spur (Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire by gift, purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, for general municipal purposes, including without limitation recreational and transportation purposes, the so-called Wonderbread Spur, located off Speen Street in Natick and shown on Town of Natick Assessors' Map 17 as Parcels 5 FA, 5 FB and 5 FC; and further, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, borrow or otherwise provide for the purposes of this article; and, further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen and other applicable boards, commissions, and personnel to apply for and receive

grants or gifts for the purposes of this article and to take all action necessary or appropriate to accomplish the purposes of this article; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 29
Acquisition of 22 Pleasant Street
(Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire by gift, purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, for open, park and recreation purposes, or other purposes that Town Meeting may authorize, the land with buildings thereon located at 22 Pleasant Street, Natick shown on Town of Natick Assessors' Map 64 as Parcel 44; and further, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, borrow or otherwise provide for the purposes of this article; and, further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen and other applicable boards, commissions, and personnel to apply for and receive grants or gifts for the purposes of this article and to take all action necessary or appropriate to accomplish the purposes of this article; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 30
Reorganization of Zoning By-Laws
(Planning Board)

To see if the Town will vote to amend and recodify the Zoning Bylaw as follows:

1. Delete in their entirety the following provisions of the existing Zoning Bylaw:
 - a. Section I: General
 - b. Section II: Use Districts
 - c. Section III: Use Regulations
 - d. Section IV: Intensity Regulations
 - e. Section V: Special Requirements
 - f. Section VI: Administration

2. Substitute the following provisions in the document entitled "Zoning Bylaw," which is on file in the Community and Economic Development Office and the Office of the Town Clerk.
 - a. Section 1.0: Purpose and Authority
 - b. Section 2.0: Districts
 - c. Section 3.0: Use Regulations
 - d. Section 4.0: Dimensional Requirements
 - e. Section 5.0: Nonconforming Uses and Structures
 - f. Section 6.0: General Regulations
 - g. Section 7.0: Special Regulations
 - h. Section 8.0: Special Residential Regulations
 - i. Section 9.0: Special District Regulations
 - j. Section 10.0: Highway Districts
 - k. Section 11.0: Administration and Procedures
 - l. Section 12.0: Definitions

Or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 31
Hear Report, Extend Term and Appropriate Funds for Tiny House Study Committee
(Tiny House Study Committee)

To see what action(s) the Town will take to:

- a) hear the report and recommendations of the Tiny House Study Committee created under Article 32 of Fall 2015 Town Meeting and/or

- b) extend the term of said committee and/or

- c) determine and to appropriate a sum of money for the study purposes of the committee including but not limited to retention of outside professionals as appropriate.

Or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 32
Amend Town of Natick By-Law Article 24, Section 3.2
(Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town of Natick By-Law Article 24, Section 3.2 as follows:

The Pay Plan shall fix the compensation for each employee covered under the Personnel By-law. Provided however that the Town Administrator, pursuant to the Employee Evaluation procedure described in Section 9 and subject to available funds, may award a single instance payment to those employees whose work exceeds expectations; said payments shall not be added to base pay. All such payments shall be reviewed and ratified by the Board of Selectmen prior to being awarded and shall be reported publicly to the Personnel Board at their next regularly scheduled meeting. Any such payments for personnel appointed by the Board of Selectmen shall be subject to their approval.

ARTICLE 33
Appropriate Funds for Design of New West Natick Fire Station
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from mitigation funds for the purpose of funding design and associated work for construction of a new Fire Station at the location of Fire Station #4 and adjoining properties (West Natick Fire Station), or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 34
Appropriate Funds to the Walcott Fund
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to the Walcott Fund, which fund was established pursuant to the will of John B. Walcott for the purpose of providing financial assistance to low-income Natick residents, or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 35
Appropriate Funds for Route 27 Design
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum of money from mitigation funds for Route 27 design and associated costs; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 36
Amend General By-Laws Regarding Directional Signage on Public Rights-of-Way
(Board of Selectmen)

To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town of Natick Bylaws to add a new section 72C to provide for directional signage on public property, or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 37
Appropriate Funds for Development of a Comprehensive Master Plan
(Planning Board)

To see what sum the Town will appropriate and raise, or otherwise provide for the next phases of the Comprehensive Master Plan consistent with Massachusetts General Law Chapter 41, Section 81D, in addition to funds appropriated under Article 29 of the 2015 Fall Annual Meeting; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 38
Acquisition of 320 Bacon Street
(Town Administrator)

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to acquire by gift, purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, for water supply protection purposes, the land with buildings

thereon located at 320 Bacon Street, Natick shown on Town of Natick Assessors' Map 26 as Parcel 130; and further, to see what sum of money the Town will vote to appropriate and raise, borrow or otherwise provide for the purposes of this article; and, further, to authorize the Board of Selectmen and other applicable boards, commissions, and personnel to apply for and receive grants or gifts for the purposes of this article and to take all action necessary or appropriate to accomplish the purposes of this article; or otherwise act thereon.

ARTICLE 39
Appropriate Funds for Abutters to Lake Street Drainage Project
(Board of Selectmen)

To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, or otherwise provide as compensation to immediate abutters to the Lake Street drainage project, or otherwise act thereon.

The above articles are to be acted upon and determined exclusively by Town Meeting Members in accordance with Chapter 2 of the Acts of 1938 and Amendments thereto and the Town Charter and subject to the referendum provided thereby.

And you are directed to serve this Warrant by causing an attested copy of said Warrant to be posted in the Post Office in said Natick; and at the following public places in said Natick, to wit: Precinct 1, Reliable Cleaners, 214 West Central Street; Precinct 2, Cole Recreation Center, 179 Boden Lane; Precinct 3, Kennedy Middle School, 165 Mill St.; Precinct 4, TCAN, 14 Summer Street; Precinct 5, Wilson Middle School, 22 Rutledge Road; Precinct 6, East Natick Fire Station, 2 Rhode Island Avenue; Precinct 7, Lilja Elementary School, 41 Bacon Street; Precinct 8, Natick High School, 15 West Street; Precinct 9, Community Senior Center, 117 East Central Street and Precinct 10, Memorial Elementary School, 107 Eliot Street.

Above locations being at least one public place in each Precinct, in the Town of Natick, and also posted in the Natick U.S. Post Office, Town Hall, Bacon Free Library and Morse Institute Library seven days at least before April 12, 2016; also by causing the titles of the articles on the Warrant for the 2016 Spring Annual Town Meeting to be published once in the Newspaper called "The Metrowest Daily News", with notice of availability of an attested copy of said Warrant, said Newspaper published in the Town of Natick and said publication to be Friday, February 19, 2016.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this Warrant with your doings thereon to the Town Clerk at or before the time appointed for holding said meeting.
