

INSTALLATION GUIDELINES FOR RESIDENTIAL SWIMMING POOLS

- Fees will be due upon submittal of signed permit application with all required documents:
 - Pool 15,000 gallons and under: \$75.00
 - Pool over 15,000 gallons: \$200.00

- A Health Agent will contact you to schedule a property inspection. Please mark the location on property where pool will be located prior to the inspection

- For all sand and diatomaceous earth filters, a sump/backwash pit is required. The sump/backwash pit shall be a minimum of 3 feet deep and 2 feet wide and subject to approval by the Board of Health.

- Once a Permit To Construct a Residential Swimming Pool has been granted, a copy of the permit and permit application will be sent to the Building Department. Contact the Building Department, (508) 647-6450, for information regarding all **additional** permitting and review processes.

- An application for a permit to construct a fence shall be simultaneously submitted to the Building Department. All swimming pool enclosures shall be a **minimum of FIVE (5) feet** and be in compliance with Natick Board of Health Regulations Chapter 14 A and all applicable State of MA and Local Building Codes.

THE POOL CANNOT BE FILLED WITH WATER UNTIL AN ADEQUATE, PERMENANT ENCLOSURE IS IN PLACE, INSPECTED, AND APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF HEALTH

PLEASE BE ADVISED If construction of the pool requires partial filling to settle vinyl lining or other surface materials, a temporary access fence is required. All temporary fencing must be made of sturdy wire that stands upright and is tightly secured to poles.

- Once all permits have been obtained and the pool and fencing have been completely installed, a final inspection must be performed by:
 - _Electrical Inspector
 - _Building Inspector
 - _Board of Health Agent

The Permit Holder and owner of the property is responsible to construct and maintain a residential swimming pool in accordance with all provisions of Chapter 14(A) Natick Board of Health Rules & Regulations Governing Residential Swimming Pools and applicable Building Regulations. Failure to do so may result in orders to correct any violation (including emptying and securing the pool) or fines levied in accordance with the Natick Board of Health Non-Criminal Disposition Procedures.

APPLICANT MUST CONFORM TO THE FOLLOWING:

PLOT PLAN

Submit, in duplicate, plot plan to scale showing all structures on the property, property lines, location of the pool, filter, sump (if required) and the location of private septic system if not connected to town sewer system.

EQUIPMENT AND SPECIFICATIONS

Provide, in duplicate, brochures and specification sheets (2 copies) to the Health Department showing materials of construction, general layout and design, circulation and filtration system of the pool to be installed. **After preliminary approval** from the Health Department the applicant shall then receive approval and additional permits from:

- Natick Building Inspector
- Natick Electrical Inspector
- Natick Plumbing Inspector (if applicable)

FENCE REQUIREMENTS

A permanent fence of chain link, stockade or equivalent with a **minimum height of FIVE (5) feet** shall be installed. All gates shall be self-closing, self latching and provided with a locking device. The gates shall be locked at all times when the pool is not in use. The fence can have no openings greater than 3 inches top to bottom except the gate. All fencing is subject to Building Department approval.

NOTIFICATIONS

THE BOARD OF HEALTH MUST BE NOTIFIED WHEN CONSTRUCTION AND ALL REQUIREMENTS OF THIS POOL ARE COMPLETED. THE POOL SHALL NOT BE FILLED WITH WATER UNTIL A SATISFACTORY INSPECTION IS COMPLETED BY THIS DEPARTMENT.

The undersigned agrees to construct and operate the aforementioned swimming pool in accordance with the provisions set forth by Chapter 14(A) Natick Board of Health Rules & Regulations Governing Residential Swimming Pools establishing a code regulating and controlling the location and construction, alteration and operation of swimming pools, issuance of permits to locate and construct, alter or operate swimming pools, and declaring and defining certain swimming pools and nuisances and fixing penalties for violations adopted by the Natick Board of Health Criminal and Non-Criminal Dispositions.

**CHAPTER 14A
BOARD OF HEALTH, NATICK, MASSACHUSETTS**

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING RESIDENTIAL SWIMMING POOLS

SECTION 1 DEFINITIONS

- 1.1 LOCATE: means to designate the site of the swimming pool on a plot plan drawn to scale showing all required setbacks.
- 1.2 CONSTRUCT: means to build or install a new swimming pool or upgrade an existing swimming pool or any of its appurtenant facilities.
- 1.3 ALTER: means to replace or modify any portion of an existing swimming pool.
- 1.4 RESIDENTIAL SWIMMING POOL: means any type of outdoor or indoor pool, which is constructed to provide recreational facilities for swimming, bathing or wading; including appurtenant buildings and equipment, established or maintained by an individual for his own family's use or use by guests of his household.
- 1.5 SPECIALTY PURPOSE POOL: means a unit designed for recreational or therapeutic purposes and not meant for swimming. These pools include, but are not limited to, therapeutic pool, hot tub, hot spa, jacuzzi, whirlpool, hydrotherapy pool, etc. These pools are not drained or refilled for each use.
- 1.6 PERMITS: Permits to construct or alter residential swimming pools shall be obtained as described in Sections 2.1 through 2.4 of these regulations.
- 1.7 ENCLOSURES: A permanent fence of chain link, stockade or equivalent, with a minimum height of 5 feet must completely surround the swimming pool. Gates must be provided with a locking device. (See Sections 3.3 & 3.4)

- 1.8 PROTECTION OF PUBLIC WATER SUPPLY: Physical connections between potable water systems and swimming pools or swimming pool circulation systems shall not be permitted. An air gap of 6 inches must be provided.
- 1.9 MAINTENANCE: Pool and pool enclosure shall be maintained as intended and the pool and the pool surroundings shall be kept clean at all times.

SECTION 2 PERMITS

- 2.1 APPROVAL TO CONSTRUCT OR ALTER: Swimming pools shall not be constructed or altered until the Board of Health has given formal approval thereof by issuance of a permit.
- 2.2 PROCEDURE TO OBTAIN A PERMIT TO CONSTRUCT OR ALTER: A permit to construct or alter a swimming pool shall not be issued until the Board of Health has received and approved an application thereof, accompanied by such plans, specifications and information as may be required by the Board of Health.
- 2.3 EXISTING SWIMMING POOLS: Construction provisions of these regulations shall not apply to legally installed swimming pools in existence at the time of adoption, except that alterations to any portion of such swimming pool shall be made in accordance with the applicable provisions of these regulations.
- 2.4 INSTALLERS PERMIT: Swimming pools shall be installed by a company or person(s) that has been approved by and obtained a swimming pool installer's license from the Board of Health. All permits are subject to annual renewal and shall expire on December 31 of each year. Above ground pools may be installed by the homeowner provided all conditions set forth in these rules and regulations are satisfied.

SECTION 3 GENERAL DESIGN AND LAYOUT

- 3.1 **LOCATION:** Swimming Pools shall be located on a certified plot plan drawn to scale showing the setbacks in relation to the following: the pool must be a minimum of 10 feet from side and rear lot lines, foundations and permanent structures; the pool must be a minimum of 20 feet from any component of a private septic system.
- 3.2 **MATERIALS OF CONSTRUCTION:** All materials used shall be durable, waterproof, easily cleanable, designed and installed according to its intended use. Pool sides and bottoms shall be smooth and free from cracks or open joints. All materials are subject to approval by the Board of Health.
- 3.3 **ENCLOSURES:** A permanent fence shall be constructed no more than 30 days after the pool is installed. The fence shall be chain link, stockade or equivalent and have a minimum height of 5 feet. Gates must be self-closing, self-latching, and provided with a locking device. The gates must be locked at all times when the pool is not in use. The fence can have no opening greater than 3 inches top to bottom except the gate. All fencing is subject to approval by the Board of Health. Four (4) foot fencing approved by the Board of Health prior to the adoption of these regulations and maintained in good condition may be continued in use. Any replacement of such fencing shall comply with these new regulations.
- 3.4 **ABOVE GROUND POOL EXCEPTION:** If the pool is an above ground pool, a sturdy, permanent 2 foot-extended fence installed at the top of pool with a locking fold-up ladder will satisfy the Board of Health enclosure requirements provided the top of the extension is a minimum of 5 feet above the surface of the ground. Ladders must be locked in the fold-up position at all times the pool is not in use.

SECTION 4 FILTERS AND CIRCULATION

- 4.1 **FILTERS AND PUMP:** All swimming pool filters and pumps must be approved by either the National Sanitation Foundation (NSF), Underwriters Laboratory (UL) or both, and be approved by the Board of Health. Filters must be designed and installed for their intended use.
- 4.2 **FILTER AND PUMP CAPACITY:** Swimming pool filters and pumps must have the capacity and horsepower to re-circulate the entire contents of the pool in 8 hours or less. Specialty purpose pool filters must have the capacity to re-circulate the entire contents of the pool within 30 minutes.
- 4.3 **SUMPS:** A sump shall be provided to receive swimming pool filter backwash water. The sump must have a minimum depth of 3 feet and a minimum inside diameter of 2 feet. All sumps must be approved by the Board of Health. Exemption from this requirement may be granted if the filter technology is approved by the Board of Health.

SECTION 5 WATER QUALITY

- 5.1 **WATER QUALITY:** Maintaining water quality shall be the responsibility of the individual(s) owning the pool. The Board of Health recommends the following guidelines for swimming pool water:

Clarity	a black 6 inch disc should be clearly visible at the deepest end of the pool
pH	maintained between 7.2 – 7.8
Free Chlorine	maintained between 1.0 - 3.0 ppm
Total Chlorine	maintained between 0.0 - 0.2 ppm
Total Alkalinity	maintained between 50 - 150 ppm

SECTION 6 FINAL INSPECTION

- 6.1 FINAL INSPECTION: After the pool and enclosure are complete a satisfactory final inspection must be performed by the 1.) Electrical Inspector, 2.) Building Inspector, then the Board of Health must be called in for a final inspection to enforce compliance with these regulations.
- 6.2 FILLING THE POOL: The pool may not be filled with water until such time that all final inspections have been satisfactorily completed.

SECTION 7 PENALTY

- (a) Criminal Complaint — Whoever violates any provisions of these rules and regulations may be penalized by indictment or on complaint brought in the District Court. Except as may otherwise be provided by law, and as the District Court may see fit to impose, the maximum penalty for any violation of these provisions shall be \$300.00 for each offense.
- (b) Non-Criminal Disposition Whoever violates any provisions of these rules and regulations may, in the discretion of the Health Agent, be penalized by a non-criminal complaint in the District Court pursuant to the provisions of the Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 21D. For the purpose of this provision the penalty to apply in the event of a violation shall be as follows: \$25.00 for the first offense; \$50.00 for the second offense; \$100.00 for the third offense; and \$200.00 for the fourth and each subsequent offense. Each day on which a violation exists shall be deemed to be a separate offense.
